NOW THIS AGREEMENT WITNESSETH AND THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

1. STRUCTURE OF THE AGREEMENT. This agreement consists of the provisions set forth in (i) this Master Services Agreement (this "MSA") and (ii) any statement of work or assignment order executed by and between the parties pursuant to and in accordance with the terms herein, including any exhibits, appendices and schedules referenced therein or attached thereto (each an "SOW" and, together with the MSA, the "Agreement"). Each SOW will include a description of the services to be provided by Service Provider to Client (the "Services") and any Client obligation in connection with the Services. Notwithstanding the foregoing, Confidential Information shall not include any information which the receiving party can show: (a) is now or subsequently becomes legally and publicly available without breach of this Agreement, by the receiving party; (b) was rightfully in the possession of the receiving party without any obligation of confidentiality prior to receiving it from the disclosing party; (c) was rightfully obtained by the receiving party from a source other than the disclosing party, which was in rightful and lawful possession of the said source, without any obligation of confidentiality; (d) was developed by or for the receiving party independently and without reference to any Confidential Information and such independent development is backed by documentary evidence.





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whereas, UNESCO MGIEP focuses on achieving the UN Sustainable Development Goal 4.7 towards education for building peaceful and sustainable societies across the world by developing programmes that promote social-emotional learning, innovate digital pedagogies and empower youth. UNESCO MGIEP is seeking to mobilize partners for the achievement of its strategic goals and programme priorities;

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP, through its Rethinking Youth Programme is building the capacities of youth especially through universities to deliver and receive high quality social-emotional learning (SEL) leveraging the power of online experiential learning on the UNESCO MGIEP FramersSpace online learning platform;

Whereas, UNESCO MGIEP in partnership with Life University (USA) has developed the *Self-directed Emotional Learning for Empathy and Kindness (SEEK)* online self-directed course based on the *Compassionate Integrity Training (CIT)* course developed by Life University and hosted on the UNESCO MGIEP GDPR-compliant Framers Space Learning Platform.

Whereas, the Partner, **MERI GROUP OF INSTITUTIONS** provides education from Pre-Primary to Post Graduate level. The Group runs a Senior Secondary School approved by Delhi Govt. & affiliated to CBSE, a Teachers Training Institute offering D. El. Ed. & ECCE recognized by the Directorate of Education, Govt. of Delhi and NCTE, an Engineering College with courses approved by AICTE, a Management College running duly approved by the AICTE, and affiliated to GGSIP University, New Delhi and a Law College affiliated to MD University and approved by the Bar Council of India. The group offers programs courses in consonance with National policies for nation building and meeting global challenges; Designing Curriculum to match International standards, needs of Industry, civil society and for inculcation of traits of Creative Thinking and Critical Analysis as well as Human and Ethical values; Establishing strategic relationships with leading National and International corporates and universities for academic as well as research collaborations.

Whereas, the Partner would like to provide the Faculty Staff and students skills in social and emotional intelligence and resilience, interpersonal skills, and holistic systems-level thinking.

Now therefore, the Parties hereby agree as follows
Article 1 – Objectives

By the present Agreement, UNESCO MGIEP and the Partner agree, through joint and concerted cooperation:

- 1.1 For the Partner to gather up to 1,000 Faculty, Staff, Students as a first trial cohort to enrol and obtain completion certification in the UNESCO MGIEP SEEK online course by January 2022;
- 1.2 For UNESCO MGIEP to deploy a Partner branded instance of the SEEK course providing free-of-cost access for the agreed first cohort of 2022 learners;
- 1.3 To provide professional thematic and technical support for all enrolled learners;
- 1.4 To promote the deployment of SEEK through the Partner's key national and



- international events
- 1.5 Following the review of the first 2022 cohort, the Partner may agree to commit additional Staff and student learners through 2 cohorts of up to 3,000 learners annually for a mutually agreed fee of Rs 500 per learner for additional specialised services by UNESCO MGIEP.

Article 2 – Obligations of UNESCO MGIEP

- 2.1 UNESCO MGIEP agrees to execute the terms of the present Agreement;
- 2.2 UNESCO MGIEP will implement a Partner-branded instance of the SEEK course on the UNESCO Framers Space platform
- 2.3 UNESCO MGIEP will provide learner support through the online Global SEEK Learner Community public access Masterclasses;
- 2.4 Only after a review and successful trial cohort and when the Partner may commit additional Staff and student learners through 2 additional cohorts of 3,000 learners annually for a mutually agreed fee of Rs 500 per learner, MGIEP will provide the following additional specialized services:
- a. Setup of the Partner Learner Community with dedicated learner support staff;
 - b. Special Masterclass sessions for the Partner learners;
 - c. UNESCO MGIEP will provide advanced training opportunities for up to 2 selected Faculty Staff to acquire Facilitator-level certification in SEEK;
 - d. UNESCO MGIEP will extensively promote the association with relevant stakeholders and invite the Partner to key national and international events.
 - e. Joint Social media promotions for SEEK outreach with the Partner
- 2.5 UNESCO MGIEP will provide full technical support for the UNESCO MGIEP SEEK course hosted on the UNESCO MGIEP FramersSpace digital learning platform including email support during Indian business hours and an escalation system of MGIEP personnel and set number of hours or days for the resolution of system issues;

Article 3 – Obligations of the Partner

- 3.1 The Partner agrees to execute the terms of the present Agreement;
- 3.2 The Partner may enroll up to 1,000 Faculty Staff and university students for the first trial cohort to enroll and obtain completion certification in SEEK by December 2022;

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- 3.3 The Partner agrees to nominate up to 2 Faculty Staff to undertake further advanced Facilitator Training in order to provide thematic and technical support to future learners from their university;
- 3.4 The Partner agrees to extensively promote the association with UNESCO MGIEP and the deployment of the SEEK course at key national and international events and relevant stakeholders;
- 3.5 The Partner may consider including SEEK as an optional credit course for building ethical values and 21st century skills for its students and provide a University certification of completion towards acquiring these credits.
- 3.6 Only after the successful completion and review of the trial cohort, the Partner may commit to the commercial deployment of SEEK at scale through the offer of a credit course offered annually to 2 cohorts of up to 3000 learners for INR 500 per learner.

Article 4 – Media activities

- 4.1 The projects, their conception, their implementation, their development, their impact and their outcome will necessitate informational and promotional activities at the initiative of - and on the part of- the parties, separately or jointly.
- 4.2 Each party is authorized to use the name, the logo and any element of the other's identity, through the use of citations, references to, reproductions, representations on the occasion of the promotion of projects, of public relations, operations, of interviews, of relations with the media (press files, articles, releases etc.) throughout the world. This use, which must adhere to the image of the concerned party, must receive the prior and written consent by UNESCO MGIEP when it relates to information activities external to the Partner.
- 4.3 The media and information support (films, photographic pictures, etc.), as well as all the rights related to them, will belong exclusively to the Party who makes and finances them. They can only be used by the other Party after the latter obtains the prior consent of the proprietary party. Notwithstanding that, the proprietary party can refuse to authorize their use if the rights given up (copyright, trademark) do not cover the foreseen exploitations.

Article 5 – General Conditions

- 5.1 Use of the Name, Emblem or Official Seal of UNESCO MGIEP

Unless authorized in writing by UNESCO MGIEP, the Partner shall not use the name, acronym or official logo of UNESCO MGIEP, or any abbreviation of the name of UNESCO, for advertising or any other purposes.



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5.2 Status of UNESCO

Supporting the objectives of UNESCO and of the United Nations Organization, the Partner will respect the status of UNESCO as an intergovernmental organization of the United Nations system with its own distinct Constitution. The Partner confirms that it is not directly involved in the production of goods or the delivery of services, which would be opposed to the objectives and principles of UNESCO, the United Nations Organization or other institutions of the United Nations system.

5.3 Status of the Partner

Nothing in this Agreement shall be construed as establishing a legal partnership (such as, by way of clarification, partnership liability), joint venture, agency, exclusive arrangement or other similar relationship. Neither the Partner nor anyone whom it may employ shall be considered as an agent of UNESCO MGIEP or a member of the staff of UNESCO MGIEP and, except as otherwise provided herein, shall not be entitled to any privileges, immunities, compensation or reimbursements, nor shall be authorized to commit UNESCO MGIEP to any expenditure or other obligations.

5.4 Conformity with Laws

The Partner agrees to respect the laws of the country it is operating in and guarantees that it will not permit any official of UNESCO MGIEP to receive a direct or indirect profit from this Agreement. Potential programs and activities between the two institutions may include, but not limited to the following:
 - a. Development of joint academic courses and programs in full compliance to the accreditation and professional requirements of both institutions;
 - b. Transfer of academic credit-bearing courses based on mutual transparency of course content and faculty qualification;
 - c. Exchange of graduate and undergraduate students for study and research;
 - d. Exchange of faculty for instruction, research and lectures;
 - e. Exchange of educational materials, research projects, publications and library materials;
 - and
 - f. Joint international conferences, seminars and workshops.
3. Proposals, including suggestions not reflected in this MOU, may be discussed and implemented on the basis of the specific agreements to be signed by both institutions.



4. This MOU shall become effective commencing from the date of signatures by both parties and it shall be for a period not to exceed five years. This MOU may be amended by the written consent of the parties.
5. The parties may review the MOU before the end of the specified period to evaluate the progress and quality of cooperation and may extend it upon the written consent of both parties. If the MOU is not renewed, it will conclude at the end of the specified time period, or after activities in progress have concluded.
6. Either party within a minimum of 90 days written notice can terminate this MOU. Activities in progress at the time of termination of this MOU shall be allowed to conclude unless otherwise agreed by both parties.
7. Each party shall designate a person or office to serve as liaison for implementing this MOU. Initially Prof. Lalit Aggarwal, MERI and Prof. Qunzhi, Zhu, Dean of the International Exchange and Cooperation Office of SUEP will coordinate the activities.
8. This MOU is to facilitate and develop a mutually beneficial educational relationship. It is not an agency contract, nor is it legally binding.

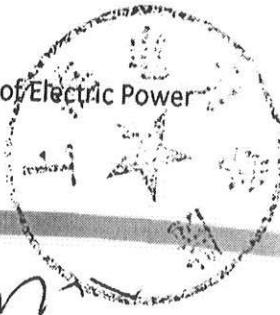

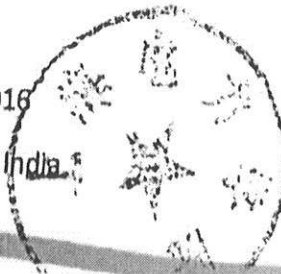
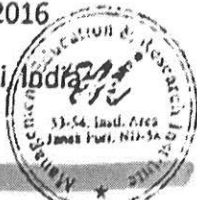

- a) Tuition fees at ESCR: the MA or MSc programme tuition fees amount **13,000 euros**. This fees are payable by transfer and divided into two instalments: firstly 3,000 euros before the deadline fixed by the Offer of Acceptance and the balance before the end of August,
- b) A partial scholarship is made available to our international students: the "Global Responsible Pioneer" scholarship. If the accepted student from MERI gets one of them, a **scholarship of from 15% up to 50% of the fees** could be deducted from the total tuition fees, before entering the Master programme.
- c) Tuition or registration fees at **MERI** (only if double registered as final year Bachelor student) to be specified and paid directly to **MERI**.
- d) There is no additional tuition fee for the Winter Session. 50% of the travel expenses will be covered by ESCR. Students should pay the rest plus all the living expenses (accommodation & food)
- e) French Social Security is mandatory, around 200 euros, the exact amount to be specified by ESCR; payable by cash via ESCR to French government Agency CPAM
- f) Alumni membership is also compulsory, a 150 euros for lifelong membership to be paid



7. The Coordinator for the MERI COLLEGE OF ENGG & TECH., MERI GROUP OF INSTITUTIONS (INDIA) is Director Prof. V. K. Kapoor, and the coordinator for the



AGREEMENT FOR ACADEMIC COOPERATION

Between

Department of Computer Science
Faculty of Science, Hong Kong Baptist University

and

MERI Group of Institutions
New Delhi, India

The Department of Computer Science, Faculty of Science, Hong Kong Baptist University (DCS-HKBU), and the MERI Group of Institutions, New Delhi, India, being termed below as Parties, have agreed as of today on the following guidelines for their cooperation in computer science research and education.

Section 1 Introduction

The purpose of this Agreement is to promote cooperation in computer science research and education between the Department of Computer Science, Faculty of Science, Hong Kong Baptist University (herein referred as DCS-HKBU) and the MERI Group of Institutions, New Delhi, India (herein referred to as MERI), in the fields of mutual interest.

Section 2 Objectives

For the realization of these objectives, both Parties agree:

- To promote the exchange of research postgraduate students;
- To promote research collaboration and academic cooperation.

Section 3 Research Postgraduate Student Exchange

To facilitate collaboration in joint research and graduate education, it is agreed that up to five (5) research postgraduate students from DCS-HKBU and MERI shall be nominated for exchange of three-month (up to one year) duration in each year. The selected student shall be nominated by the home university for admission as an exchange student at the host university. Each nomination shall be accompanied by:

1. a curriculum vitae;
2. a statement of aptitude from a faculty member of the home university; and
3. a specific program of study at the host university.



The host university shall evaluate each selected student and determine his/her eligibility for admission as an exchange student at the discretion of the host university.

Tuition fees are paid to the home university, and are waived by the host university. The home university has the discretion to impose certain non-academic or non-obligatory fees on their exchange students.

Unless otherwise agreed, each graduate exchange student shall be responsible for his/her own living and traveling expenses. The exchange student is also responsible for all expenses of accompanying spouse and/or dependent(s).

Section 4 Confidentiality

Neither of the Parties shall, at any time, disclose to any third party, any confidential information of the other Party, which is acquired in pursuant to this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld.

Section 5 Amendments

Both Parties are entitled to propose amendments to the current agreement. In order to become effective, the amendments must be recognized by both Parties in a written protocol or memorandum.

Section 6 Period of Agreement

The Agreement comes into force on the date of signature and is valid from December 2014 to November 2018. If either Party wishes to extend, new negotiation for new agreement is required.

The termination of Agreement shall not affect the implementation of all engagement prior to such termination.

Section 7 Sharing of Research Results

The research output obtained through this exchange programme will be shared between both parties. For thesis and other research outputs, the listing of the participants will be according to the proportion of the contribution of the participants. The proposer of the research topic will be the coordinator of the thesis author.

Section 8 Legal Obligations





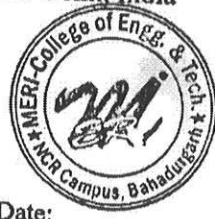

The Joliot-Curie High School is directed by Mrs. Isabelle Callard, Principal, two Assistant Principals, Mrs. Rondeleux and Mrs. Laplanche. It has the distinction of being located on the outskirts of Paris, 10 km from the Champs Elysees and in the heart of the business district of Paris -La Défense. Lycée Joliot-Curie has special ties to the University of Paris Ouest - La Défense also located in Nanterre and opens internationally to immerse its pupils / students in globalization. The Joliot-Curie High School sees the partnership with MERI group as an opportunity for students to discover the capital of a great country, present on the international stage, and to develop linguistic exchanges in English at the same time.

THE AXIS OF PARTNERSHIP

1. Axis (pedagogical)

The exchange through the pairing is open to all classes of the Lycée Joliot-Curie in which teachers would be willing to target better learning of English. It can be set up as an English language exchange for all sections. An opening to the international stage with a country like India in the heart of globalization and the MERI group whose tertiary education is the heart of the educational plan, can be beneficial especially to our students of STMG and students of BTS NRC that addresses this partnership as a priority.

2. Axis (cultural)

India is a great nation in economic, democratic, but also cultural. Its heritage and old customs make it a country whose study is of greatest interest for our students. Delhi is the hub of the Indian economy and political basis of democratic power of this nation, but equally cultural base to discover where the Lotus Temple, a symbol of world peace, among other was erected. In addition, the discovery of the Indian way of life in Indian families that our pupils / students will be at the heart of reality, certainly in affluent families, the traditional way of life of the population of this country.

3. Axis (physical mobility)

The education of MERI group is based on learning the management techniques and business as well as IT. Our pupils/students in tertiary section could benefit from a new approach of learning their specialty, more in English, in an economic and cultural context source of a real enrichment at the heart of the capital of a country leader BRICS, known to have a role increasingly important on the international stage.

The level of academic expectations of MERI group being equivalent to the requirements of BTS, students of both partners would see the favoured linguistic exchange.

EXCHANGE AND ACCOMMODATION

We would like to set up an exchange program of pupils or volunteer students belonging to MGT BTS sections of our establishment.



Besides the language input in English and teaching in technology education for our pupils / students, a personal exchange with an Indian student would allow a better opening to the world, intercultural exchange, taking into account other needs and realization of his responsibility towards the other.

Beyond the school / university exchange, these are the values of the citizens of the world which develop in our youth.

The programme of cultural tours and educational contributions would be freely negotiated by teachers and different directions before each journey.

The welcome of our pupils / students in India would be in the Indian families of the students of MERI group. It should be noted that these are very well-off families of the city of Delhi that are likely to have them. Our pupils / students would participate in courses in the MERI group according to their section (CFE / CGRH / SIO BTS NRC). In addition, with their accompanying teachers would be organized cultural trips to Delhi to discover the capital of the Indian subcontinent.

And vice versa Indian students would be received in French families in the same way as French students in India.

Memorandum of Understanding

1. Management Education Research Institute-Group of Institutions (MERI – Group of Research Institutions), India and Shanghai University of Electric Power (SUEP), China establish this MOU to foster international cooperation in education, research and cultural exchange. Both institutions seek to develop mutually beneficial programs for their students, faculty, departments, and research institutes within the provision of this MOU.
2. This MOU represents a commitment by both institutions to enter into discussion and negotiation concerning the activities listed below. The two institutions affirm that these discussions would conclude in various agreements that are mutually beneficial. Potential programs and activities between the two institutions may include, but not limited to the following:
 - a. Development of joint academic courses and programs in full compliance to the accreditation and professional requirements of both institutions;
 - b. Transfer of academic credit-bearing courses based on mutual transparency of course content and faculty qualification;
 - c. Exchange of graduate and undergraduate students for study and research;
 - d. Exchange of faculty for instruction, research and lectures;
 - e. Exchange of educational materials, research projects, publications and library materials; and
 - f. Joint international conferences, seminars and workshops.
3. Proposals, including suggestions not reflected in this MOU, may be discussed and implemented on the basis of the specific agreements to be signed by both institutions.



4. This MOU shall become effective commencing from the date of signatures by both parties and it shall be for a period not to exceed five years. This MOU may be amended by the written consent of the parties.
5. The parties may review the MOU before the end of the specified period to evaluate the progress and quality of cooperation and may extend it upon the written consent of both parties. If the MOU is not renewed, it will conclude at the end of the specified time period, or after activities in progress have concluded.
6. Either party within a minimum of 90 days written notice can terminate this MOU. Activities in progress at the time of termination of this MOU shall be allowed to conclude unless otherwise agreed by both parties.
7. Each party shall designate a person or office to serve as liaison for implementing this MOU. Initially Prof. Lalit Aggarwal, MERI and Prof. Qunzhi, Zhu, Dean of the International Exchange and Cooperation Office of SUEP will coordinate the activities.
8. This MOU is to facilitate and develop a mutually beneficial educational relationship. It is not an agency contract, nor is it legally binding.

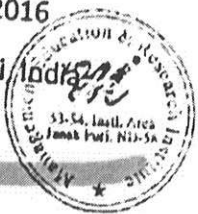

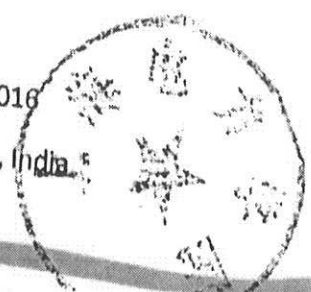

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AGREEMENT FOR ACADEMIC COOPERATION

Between

Department of Computer Science
Faculty of Science, Hong Kong Baptist University

and

MERI Group of Institutions
New Delhi, India

The Department of Computer Science, Faculty of Science, Hong Kong Baptist University (DCS-HKBU), and the MERI Group of Institutions, New Delhi, India, being termed below as Parties, have agreed as of today on the following guidelines for their cooperation in computer science research and education.

Section 1 Introduction

The purpose of this Agreement is to promote cooperation in computer science research and education between the Department of Computer Science, Faculty of Science, Hong Kong Baptist University (herein referred as DCS-HKBU) and the MERI Group of Institutions, New Delhi, India (herein referred to as MERI), in the fields of mutual interest.

Section 2 Objectives

For the realization of these objectives, both Parties agree:

- To promote the exchange of research postgraduate students;
- To promote research collaboration and academic cooperation.

Section 3 Research Postgraduate Student Exchange

To facilitate collaboration in joint research and graduate education, it is agreed that up to five (5) research postgraduate students from DCS-HKBU and MERI shall be nominated for exchange of three-month (up to one year) duration in each year. The selected student shall be nominated by the home university for admission as an exchange student at the host university. Each nomination shall be accompanied by:

1. a curriculum vitae;
2. a statement of aptitude from a faculty member of the home university; and
3. a specific program of study at the host university.



The host university shall evaluate each selected student and determine his/her eligibility for admission as an exchange student at the discretion of the host university.

Tuition fees are paid to the home university, and are waived by the host university. The home university has the discretion to impose certain non-academic or non-obligatory fees on their exchange students.

Unless otherwise agreed, each graduate exchange student shall be responsible for his/her own living and traveling expenses. The exchange student is also responsible for all expenses of accompanying spouse and/or dependent(s).

Section 4 Confidentiality

Neither of the Parties shall, at any time, disclose to any third party, any confidential information of the other Party, which is acquired in pursuant to this Agreement without the prior written consent of the other Party, such consent not to be unreasonably withheld.

Section 5 Amendments

Both Parties are entitled to propose amendments to the current agreement. In order to become effective, the amendments must be recognized by both Parties in a written protocol or memorandum.

Section 6 Period of Agreement

The Agreement comes into force on the date of signature and is valid from December 2014 to November 2018. If either Party wishes to extend, new negotiation for new agreement is required.

The termination of Agreement shall not affect the implementation of all engagement prior to such termination.

Section 7 Sharing of Research Results

The research output obtained through this exchange programme will be shared between both parties. For thesis and other research outputs, the listing of the participants will be according to the proportion of the contribution of the participants. The proposer of the research topic will be the coordinator of the thesis author.


Section 8 Legal Obligations



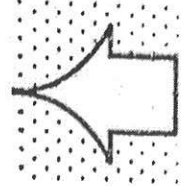

2- The two institutions agree to promote mutually beneficial activities in the areas of education, research and other academic issues, and to cooperate and work together towards the internationalisation of higher education. Such cooperation may include, but is not limited, to:

- Exchange of students
- Joint programs and double-degree agreement
- Exchange of faculty members
- Admission as degree-seeking students on a fee-paying basis
- Joint research projects
- Joint conferences
- Co-supervision of thesis
- Organisation of executive programs for the professional community
- Short study abroad seminar: winter session, summer programme
- Executive education: virtual projects, study tour



3- All the activities carried out under the terms of this agreement shall be separately negotiated and determined by both institutions, subject to availability of resources, giving consideration to the special strengths and limitations of each institution. Such cooperative agreement is not intended to be a legally binding document, but rather is intended to describe the nature and the guidelines for mutually beneficial cooperation.


Nothing, therefore, shall diminish the full autonomy of either Institution, in carrying out the agreement.

If this agreement is terminated, all engagement prior to the date of termination must be performed.



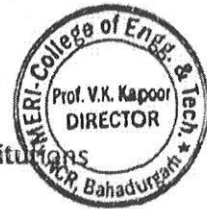

The objective of the present Agreement is to develop academic cooperation between ISEP and MERI for joint education in Information Technology, Electronics and Telecommunication..

1.1 Understanding of Terms

"Home Institution" is the Institution in which the student is originally enrolled for an Integrated Programme.

"Host Institution" is the Institution to which the student is attached for the duration of his/her exchange.

"ISEP" is the Institution delivering the Engineer degree and the MSc degree and in which the student is registered after the 7 first semesters in the Home Institution.

"MERI" is the Institution in which the student is registered for the seven first semesters of the programme.

"Integrated MSc Programme" is defined as a 10-semester programme: 7 consecutive academic semesters run by MERI in the Home Institution and named "Electronics and Computer Engineering Programme (ECEP)", followed by 2 semesters run by ISEP in the Host Institution and a one-semester internship.

"Joint MSc Programme" is defined as a 4-semester programme after the BSc: 2 consecutive academic semesters run by MERI in the Home Institution followed by 1 semester run by ISEP in the Host Institution and a one-semester internship.

"Integrated Engineer Programme" is defined as a 12-semester programme: 7 consecutive academic semesters at the Home Institution and named "Electronics and Computer Engineering Programme (ECEP)", followed by 4 semesters in the Host institution and one-semester internship.

"Integrated Programme" is either an Integrated MSc Programme or an Integrated Engineer Programme.

"Integrated Exchange Period" is defined as three consecutive academic semesters (terms), in which the student is registered in MSc Programme or five consecutive academic semesters (terms), in which the student is registered in Engineer Programme or two consecutive academic semesters (terms), in which the student is registered in Joint MSc Programme.

"Exchange Student" is the one who participates in the Integrated Exchange Period.



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1.2 Student Exchange

- 1.21 Proposals for Exchange Students must be made in advance and agreed upon with sufficient notice to both parties.
- 1.22 The Home Institution will be responsible for screening and selecting students for this Programme, subject to acceptance by the Host Institution. The Host Institution may in consultation with the Home Institution reject any applicant whose academic or other qualifications for participation in the programme are not found to be appropriate.
- 1.23 Academic Exchange Student will be subject to the academic rules and discipline of the Host Institution. Where applicable the host Institution will periodically inform the Home Institution of the academic progress of participants in the programme.
- 1.24 The Host Institution will make reasonable efforts to assist the Academic Exchange Student to obtain housing and with other matters of hospitality, but is not obliged to provide housing or financial assistance of any kind whatsoever.
- 1.25 Exchange Students shall be responsible for obtaining their own visas and completing the required immigration formalities, and for obtaining the travel and other related documents needed to pursue studies at the Host Institution. However, Host institution will help/facilitate the exchange student in this effort.
- 1.26 If the Exchange Student voluntarily withdraws before the end of his/her programme of study, it will be considered a completed exchange and the tuition fees will not be refunded.
- 1.27 The following modes of operation are possible under this Agreement:
- [a] An Exchange Student shall be admitted to the MSc Programme in the Host Institution after completion of the ECEP in the Home Institution.
 - [b] An Exchange Student shall be admitted to the Engineer Programme if his level in French language is sufficient or he gets the required credits which shall be communicated to him before the start of the programme. This admission takes place after completion of the ECEP in the Home Institution followed by one semester in the Host Institution.
 - [c] An Exchange Student who spends two semesters after the BSc in the Home Institution and shall be admitted to the Joint MSc Programme.
 - [d] An Exchange Student who spends one semester after the BSc (if the skills matches with the requirements of the Engineering Degree Programme) in the Home Institution and shall be admitted to the Integrated Engineer Programme if his level in French language is sufficient or he gets the required credits which shall be communicated to him before the start of the programme.
 - [e] An Exchange Student is awarded the MSc degree or the Engineer degree if he/her fulfils the Host Institution degree award rules and requirements.



1.3 Student Enrolment, Attendance and Assessment

- 1.3.1 Exchange Students will be enrolled in a specific programme that has been agreed in advance by the two Institutions, and specially designed to fulfil Host Institution admission requirements.
- 1.3.2 To be considered as an Exchange Student, a student must pass successfully the final test carried out jointly at the Home Institution and must obtain the required number of credits from the continuing control. The weight given to each component must be agreed in advance by the two institutions.

1.4 Fees and Other Expenses

- 1.4.1 Exchange Students will pay the amount corresponding to ECEP tuition and other fees at their Home Institution.
- 1.4.2 The amount due to the Host Institution (as defined in the addendum I) is transferred by the Home Institution to the Host Institution at the start of each semester.
- 1.4.3 An Exchange Student must pay to the Host Institution the amount due and corresponding to the MSc Programme, Joint MSc Programme or Engineer Programme (as defined in the addendum) after his/her admission notification. The Exchange Student must comply with the payment schedule as defined in the addendum.
- 1.4.4 Upon reception of the amount due, the Host Institution will deliver a confirmation of enrolment letter allowing the Exchange Students to request a student visa. Confirmation letter is also to be sent to the Home Institution after the selection.
- 1.4.5 If an Exchange Student does not receive his visa through no fault of his own (with official proof), there will be a full refund of the amount by the Host Institution.
- 1.4.6 Exchange Students will also pay for all personal expenses incurred at the Host Institution, including visa, housing, travel, meals, health insurance, books and stationery required.

1.5 Insurance

All Exchange Students will be required to purchase adequate health (including hospitalisation) insurance as determined by the Host Institution for the exchange period.

1.6 Joint Research and Faculty Exchange

The Parties agree to undertake joint research as well as Faculty Exchange Programme within the areas of educational cooperation on mutually consented basis.

1.7 Force Majeure

Neither party shall be responsible to the other for any delay in performance or non-performance due to any causes beyond the reasonable control of the parties hereto, but the affected party shall promptly, upon the occurrence of any such cause, inform the other party in writing, stating that such cause has delayed or prevented its performance hereunder. In such circumstances neither party shall be liable (financially or otherwise) for any effects attributable to such circumstances, but both parties shall use their reasonable endeavours to mitigate such effects for the students, the staff, and any others involved.



1.8 **TERM AND TERMINATION**

- 1.8.1 This Agreement shall be for a period of 8 years from the date of this agreement, and shall continue in force unless terminated by either party in accordance with clause 1.8.2.
- 1.8.2 Either party shall be entitled at any time and at its absolute discretion to terminate the Agreement by giving written notice six months beforehand to the other party. Such termination shall not affect exchange periods in hand at the time of the termination.

1.7 **MODIFICATION**

This Agreement may be modified by agreement in writing and signed by the two parties.

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MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU-1)

General Partnership

BETWEEN

MANAGEMENT EDUCATION & RESEARCH INSTITUTE - GROUP OF INSTITUTIONS
called MERI

AND

"n+i" NETWORK OF ENGINEERING INSTITUTES called "n+i"

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is signed between Management Education & Research Institute – Group of institutions (hereinafter referred to as MERI) and "n+i" Network of Engineering Institutes (hereinafter referred to as "n+i" Network).

1. Preamble

MERI and "n+i" recognise:

- a. their mutual interest in training engineers with an international vocation,
- b. the importance of the role of higher education institutions in the promotion of relations and their contribution to social development.

and MERI and "n+i" undertake to:

- c. consider the introduction of a dual international Master's programme for engineering students in order for the latter to be able to complete their training in C Country and France.
- d. inform their competent ministries (or official bodies, such as the CTI – Commission for Engineering Qualifications – in France) about their arrangement in order to obtain their approval.

The term *partner institutions* used in this agreement refers to MERI and "n+i". "n+i" shall serve as the exclusive coordinator on behalf of its members.

2. Field of Cooperation

Cooperation between the two institutions may be established within any field related to Science, Engineering and Technology,

Cooperation will concern the promotion and the exchange of students.

The two institutions agree to promote, to their students, the possibilities of studies and training in their partner institutions (MERI for French Students and "n+i" Network for Country Students).

Cooperation in the areas of Research, Long distance learning programs, short exchanges, invitation of academics, etc... could be discussed and will be subject of separate agreements.

3. General Principles

In France Master's degree requires 120 credits minimum (European ECTS standards) generally done in a minimum of two years (or more) starting right after a Bachelor degree. We will refer to the first year as M1 and to the second as M2. In France, year M1 is generally organized in 2 semesters (M1a and M1b) it is the same for M2 (M2a and M2b) as follow:

Two kind of masters, both accredited on behalf the French Government, are offered by French Engineering institutes

The "n+" Master's degree (or Diplôme d'ingénieur in France) prepares students for project and team management positions (many company chief executives and directors have been trained as engineers). Given its level, requirements and international recognition, and to indicate its extremely comprehensive and more generalist content, it is called the "n+" Master's degree as a "Master's degree with Honours".

This degree is delivered by schools authorised by the French Commission for Engineering degrees (CTI) and is recognized as a national Master's degree.

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CTI imposes for this Master's degree programme a minimum training in France of 3 semesters minimum in France. Due to this regulation the "n+" Master's length of studies cannot be reduced.

The "I" Master's degree so called to stress its international "I" nature.

This degree is delivered by schools authorized by the French DGESIP (Higher Education and Professional Integration official organization).

The validation of experience (courses, training, even work experience...) in the country of origin can reduce the length of training in France to 12 months minimum. This Master's degree, focused on a specific scientific or technical area, includes at the end a long training period in a company or research Centre (lab) of 6 months minimum.

4. Promotion and Exchange of Students

- 4.1 The exchange will concern students who will be engaged in Master's Degree Programmes.
- 4.2 This programme is focused on full time students having a minimum background of bachelor, licence or equivalent in Sciences, Engineering, or Technology (or equivalent in terms of relevant credits validated by both institutions from «C country» and France).
- 4.3 Each institution will select, among their students, highly motivated candidates for studies abroad (selection by MERI of Country candidates wishing to go to France and by French Engineering Institutes of French candidates for studies or training in MERI).
- 4.4 Students will apply through the "n+i" website. Each partner of this agreement (MERI and "n+i" Network) will have access to the application forms of students stored on the "n+i" Network database by using a confidential login and password given by "n+i" Network.
- 4.5 In order to respect the French law regarding the rights of people who have personal information stored in a database, each partner, by signing this agreement certifies that:
 - a) they will never transfer the confidential login and password to anybody even from the same University or Institute,
 - b) they will never use this database for any other purpose different than the recruitment of students for Engineering Studies with "n+i" Network.
- 4.6 Parties will check hard copies of application "paper" forms of candidates before sending them to the collaborating institution(s) within a reasonable time before the start of the academic programme. These hard copies of the application forms will be sent to "n+i" Network staff who will control and validate electronic applications forms.
- 4.7 Only students with validated application forms could be selected
- 4.8 MERI and "n+i" Network welcoming students for a period from 6 months up to 2 years (or more) will inform the student what kind of qualification they will gain (degree, diploma, certificate, etc..).
- 4.9 Students involved in this exchange will receive a certificate for a transfer of credits (European ECTS on the French side) in respect with the training done abroad. If the



work and the number of credits comply with the national regulations, the students will receive the degree from the foreign institution (ex: Master degree after 2 years in France).

- 4.10 Students of either institution, who wish to undertake a "n+i" Network programme, will be assisted by the host institution for administrative registration and daily requirements including, but not limited to, accommodation, transport, office, library and laboratory facilities, etc.
- 4.11 The student exchange shall bear on theoretical and practical academic teaching as well as on professional training and internships.

5. MOA regarding Master's degree

Following case 1, the two institutions agree to study the possibility of awarding a Master degree with "experience abroad" or joint master degrees for well selected students willing to complete their engineering training in Country and France (single or double degree). MEMORANDUM OF UNDERSTANDING (MOU-2)

Last semester of Bachelor as an international experience in France

BETWEEN

MANAGEMENT EDUCATION & RESEARCH INSTITUTE - GROUP OF INSTITUTIONS
called MERI

AND

"n+i" NETWORK OF ENGINEERING INSTITUTES called "n+i"

This Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) is signed between **Management Education & Research Institute – Group of institutions** (hereinafter referred to as MERI) and "**n+i**" Network of Engineering Institutes (hereinafter referred to as "**n+i**" Network).

1. Preamble

MERI and "n+i" recognise:

- a. their mutual interest in training engineers with an international vocation,
- b. the importance of the role of higher education institutions in the promotion of relations and their contribution to social development.

and MERI and "n+i" undertake to:

- c. consider the introduction of a dual international Master's programme for engineering students in order for the latter to be able to complete their training in C Country and France.
- d. inform their competent ministries (or official bodies, such as the CTI – Commission for Engineering Qualifications – in France) about their arrangement in order to obtain their approval.

The term *partner institutions* used in this agreement refers to MERI and "n+i". "n+i" shall serve as the exclusive coordinator on behalf of its members.

2. Field of Cooperation

Cooperation between the two institutions may be established within any field related to Science, Engineering and Technology,

Cooperation will concern students from both sides. They will have the opportunity to complete an international period of training as a part of their own local degree (no degree from the foreign counterpart).

The two institutions agree to promote, to their students, the possibilities of studies and training in their partner institutions (MERI for French Students and "n+i" Network for Country Students).

Cooperation in the areas of Research, Long distance learning programs, short exchanges, invitation of academics, etc... could be discussed and will be subject of separate agreements.

3. Promotion and Exchange of Students

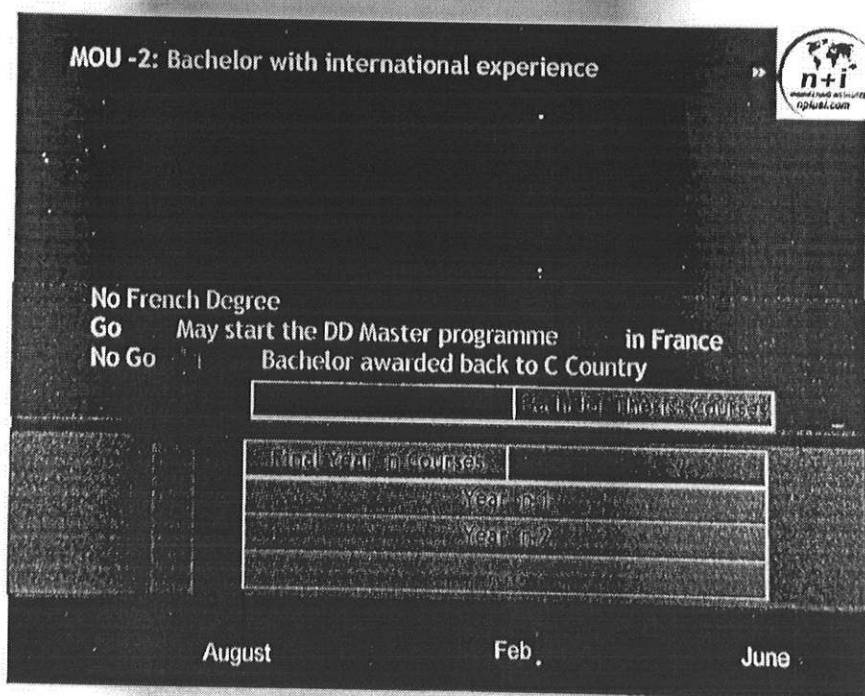
- 4.1 The exchange will concern students who will be engaged in Bachelor and/or Master's Degree Programmes.
- 4.2 This programme is focused on full time students having a **background** in Sciences, Engineering, or Technology (or equivalent in terms of relevant credits validated by both institutions from «C country» and France).
- 4.3 Each institution will select, among their students, highly motivated candidates for studies abroad (selection by MERI of Country candidates wishing to go to France and by French Engineering Institutes of French candidates for studies or training in MERI).
- 4.4 Students will apply through the "n+i" website. Each partner of this agreement (MERI and "n+i" Network) will have access to the application forms of students stored on the "n+i" Network database by using a confidential login and password given by "n+i" Network.
- 4.5 In order to respect the French law regarding the rights of people who have personal information stored in a database, each partner, by signing this agreement certifies that:
 - a) they will never transfer the confidential login and password to anybody even from the same University or Institute,
 - b) they will never use this database for any other purpose different than the recruitment of students for Engineering Studies with "n+i" Network.
- 4.6 Parties will check hard copies of application "paper" forms of candidates before sending them to the collaborating institution(s) within a reasonable time before the



- start of the academic programme. These hard copies of the application forms will be sent to "n+i" Network staff who will control and validate electronic applications forms.

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The C Country students are welcomed in France for their last period of Bachelor in order to complete their research and/ or courses leading to the only bachelor degree from C Country.

During this period students will benefit from packages for Cultural, Linguistic and Methodological integration (see website).

Best students willing to start a double Master degree programme will be recruited and should join a double Master degree as described in MOA's.

6. Funding and Finance

6.1 Students pay where they are studying. Students will have to pay the local fees for tuition, insurance, transport and accommodation and any other appropriate expenses for the selected programme, but both institutions agree to source the lowest fees to students and/or to **seek financial support** for students for cooperative activities from appropriate funding institutions but they cannot be responsible if they fail to find any funding.
